# Who Are We?

---

In 1991 Colorado voters approved a constitutional amendment to allow limited-stakes gaming in Central City, Black Hawk, and Cripple Creek with the condition that a portion of gaming tax revenue be redistributed through a grants program to preserve Colorado's historic sites.

This grant program is called the State Historical Fund

Mission: to foster heritage preservation through tangible and highly visible projects for direct and demonstrable public benefit. We have awarded more than \$277 million dollars to over 4,200 grants in all 64 Colorado counties.

# Non-Competitive



Emergency Grants fund the stabilization of significant resources that are in imminent danger of being lost, demolished, or seriously damaged due to unforeseen events or acts of nature.



Historic Structure Assessment (HSAs) assess the current condition of historic properties to identify needs and their level of urgency. Can also be used to explore possible future uses



Archaeological Assessment Plan, preserve, study, and document archaeological resources for the purpose of future archaeological work



# Competitive



Acquisition & Development grants help fund the stabilization, preservation, restoration, rehabilitation, reconstruction, and/or acquisition of a designated property, site, or landscape



Education projects help interpret historic sites, develop programming and many other projects including videos, interpretive signage, brochures, books, websites, walking tours, conferences, field schools



Survey and Planning grants help communities identify, record, evaluate, designate, and/or plan for the protection of historic sites, properties or landscapes



Archaeological Assessment Plans, help communities and organizations preserve, study, and document archaeological resources for the purpose of future archaeological work
